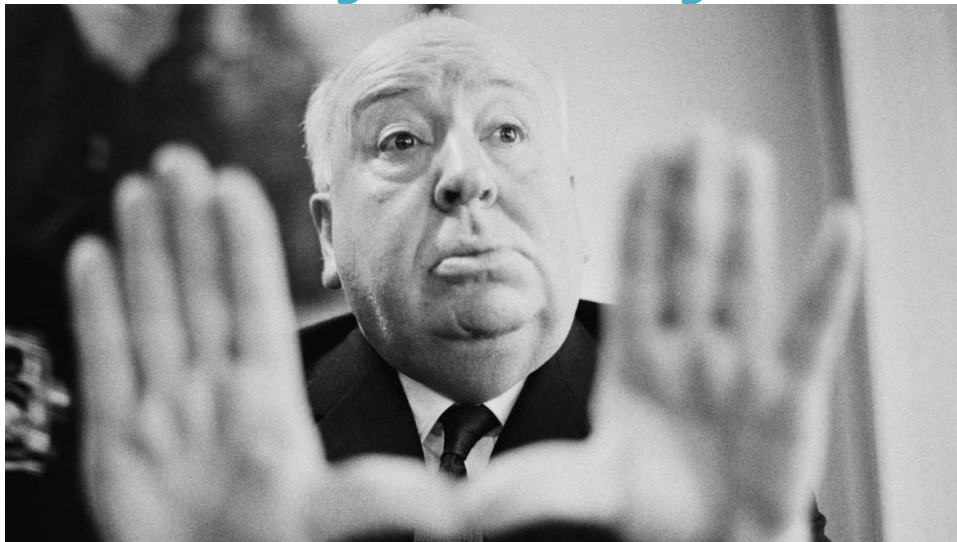


# Inspirational Afternoon

## The Interesting Life Of Alfred Hitchcock

We've already seen programs about the importance of Alfred Hitchcock's output on the history of cinema. However, few people actually realize that Hitchcock was the inventor of what we call the suspense film, films exemplified by movies such as *Halloween* (1978) and *Friday The 13th* (1980). In this program, we'll gain deep insight as we explore Alfred Hitchcock's troubled childhood where his neurosis originated from having been raised in Victorian England, and we'll ascertain how this directly resulted in his inner rage and desires being expressed through such films as *The Lodger* (1927), *Rope* (1948), *Psycho* (1960), *Torn Curtain* (1966), and *Frenzy* (1972). We will also examine films that were highly influenced by Hitchcock such as *Bird With The Crystal Plumage* (1971) and more. Not your typical take on Hitchcock, but rather the turning of a whole new page in the master's career.
